**MESSAGE TO THE SECOND ANNUAL SUMMIT  
OF CHINA GREEN COMPANIES**  
**Beijing, 22 April 2009**

As innovative business leaders, your vision and dynamism are essential for building a greener economy that offers significant benefits to your fellow citizens and the world at large. I am encouraged that some of you are engaged in the United Nations Global Compact and its “Climate and Water initiative – Caring for Climate” and CEO Water Mandate.
