Alistair: My name is Alistair Burtenshaw. I'm Director of the London Book Fair, a

role I've been doing for the last eleven years.

Li: Very glad to meet you Alistair. How would you describe this year's London

Book Fair, in terms of its scale and impact?

Alistair: Well, this year's London Book Fair is the biggest ever and we're absolutely

thrilled to be welcoming China as our Market Focus country here at the

London Book Fair.

Li: I would be interested to know - why do you think that the British public,

or globally, there is an interest in China?

Alistair: Well, I've been visiting China for the last nine years and during my seven

visits I've seen for myself just how dynamic China is and what a thriving and exciting culture China has. And we're absolutely thrilled to be able to welcome so many contemporary Chinese writers as well. Of course, China is now the world's second largest economy, it's the world's most populous country, and of course it's the world's largest publishing marketplace by

volume of books.

Li: As Alistair said, China took centre stage in the exhibition hall 据说前来参展

Man: I've been coming here for 25 years and it changes every year.

Li: What is the biggest change this year?

Man: The biggest change? Well, I think China is the biggest change this year.

It's very large in the hall next door.

Li: I know. Why do you think that people are very interested in China

nowadays?

Man: Because I don't think a lot of people know what China is like. So,

obviously, they go and see all the memorabilia and all the antiquities that

have come to the UK, so I think people are very interested, yes.

Alistair: Well, I think the biggest change in this year's London Book Fair is really

the impact of digital technology and digital publishing on books. And I've seen the same thing when I've been in China, that there's a huge amount of reading on mobile phones and there's much digital publishing. And it's quite similar here; it's not exactly the same because people read less on mobile phones but they do read on e-book readers, for example, so not just in print. And of course the big topic that's being discussed by

publishers is - how can they make books really exciting for readers to read online or to read on mobile telephones or to read on e-book readers? And it's leading to lots of great creativity and lots of great new ideas about

what a book will be in the future.

the market is changing, so it's quite exciting. I love to read so it's nice to have a look at Penguin and Faber and Bloomsbury and see which new books are going to be coming out. I've just found out that Virginia Woolf's great-niece has written a book that's coming out — and I love Virginia

Woolf, so that was quite exciting.
